

- 1: Moderators Snapshot On Sunday evening I had the privilege of preaching at a joint pastorate ecumenical service (at Ashton-on-Mersey URC in the pastorate with Sale URC, with Revd Brian Acty leading the worship in the snapshot). For many of our congregations in the Synod the focus on the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a great opportunity for gathering with local ecumenical sister congregations to reflect on the call of Christ to be one, and for prayer together for our common mission in each community. It was an uplifting time at Ashton-on-Mersey URC through the focus on the CTBI prepared materials, with the particular input for this year coming from Christians in Germany. The German churches involved in preparing the materials focused on the Scripture reading in 2 Corinthians 5:14-20, and the theme of *Crossing Barriers*. Please pray for:
 - continued opportunities for prayer with our ecumenical partners in our communities
 - a willingness in each community for sister congregations to seek fresh opportunities for sharing their life and witness in a unified way "that the world may believe"
 - encouragement for those in Christian leadership in their work involved in Crossing Barriers, whether at a national, regional, or local level
 - every member of our congregations to have a heart for developing strong relationships with our sisters and brothers in other churches, that we might support, encourage, and pray for one another to bear fruit of the Kingdom of God



2: Jesus at the Movies Jesus has been portrayed in many ways in film; controversial and



comforting, disturbing and frustrating. We will explore how four different films have presented Jesus by watching the film and by having a short discussion after each one to see how the depiction helps, or hinders, our understanding of Jesus.

Wednesday 1st **February:** Godspell Written in 1971, this controversial musical, presents the parables partly through reworked traditional hymns. Jesus and the apostles are presented as

hippies which raised some eyebrows.

Thursday 9th February Jesus Christ Superstar Tim Rice and Andrew Lloyd Weber wrote this in 1970 as a rock opera focusing, in particular, on Jesus' relationship with Judas and Mary Magdalene. Some felt it wasn't faithful to the Gospels and focused too much on Jesus and Judas as conflicted revolutionaries.

Thursday 16th February Son of Man This 2006 film sets Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection in modern day South Africa. The film: stimulates thinking and uses musical beat, rapid rhythms, alternation of several styles and original shots to ensure that the film is always stimulating. Nothing is obvious in it; the story as we know it is turned upside down.

Tuesday 28th **February** The Passion of the Christ Mel Gibson's 2004 film was controversial for its detailed portrayal of the torture and crucifixion of Jesus. It draws on a reconstruction of the Passion by a Germany mystical nun and uses Latin and Aramaic dialogue. Not for the faint hearted!

4: Review of the Global Partnership between the NW Synod of the URC the Chaiyi Presbytery of the PCT in Taiwan There has been a Global Partnership between the North Western Synod of the URC and the Chaiyi Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church of Taiwan (PCT) since 2007. Between 2007 and 2011 activities included 4 exchanges (2 each way) and a visit by the NW Synod Moderator. In 2007, a group of four lay people from Lancashire Area visited Chaiyi Presbytery and there was a return visit of ministers from Chiayi in 2008. In October 2009, four lay people, age range 17 to 64, went to Chiayi and visited churches, schools, a university and a hospital as well as the PCT offices in Taipei. A group of five ministers and one lay person visited the NW Synod in November 2010 and as well as attending Synod at Penrith, visited projects at a number of local churches in the Synod. Richard Church, the Synod Moderator, also visited Chiayi and the PCT annual Assembly. The partnership was reviewed and renewed in 2011 and is now due for review and possible renewal.

In July 2015 6 young people from North Western Synod and 3 leaders visited Taiwan. They were hosted by the Chaiyi Presbytery of the PCT and helped at holiday clubs in local churches and visited Chaiyi City, Ali Mountain, Tainan and Taipei. In July 2016 8 young people and 2 leaders came from Taiwan to the North West. They spent the first week in local churches – Darwen, Sedburgh, Bolton and Bamford and Norden. They were involved in holiday clubs, Messy Church, work with old people, work with refugees and leading worship. During the second week they visited the Windermere Centre, had a trip to London and visited Church House and of course spent a few days in Manchester.

A group consisting of Barbara Redmond, Global Links Co-ordinator, Angela Bogg, representative from the Synod World Church Group, Stuart Nixon, Synod Executive representative and Alison Greaves, one of the young people involved in the Youth Exchange.
